MAGISTRATE'S COMPLAINT

The Attorney General of Guam hereby accuses CARLOS ROBERT COMPTON CAMACHO of a certain crime committed as follows:

On or about the 13th day of August, 2021, in Guam, CARLOS ROBERT COMPTON CAMACHO did commit the offense of Possession of a Firearm Without Valid Identification (As

a Third Degree Felony), in that he knowingly possessed a firearm, specifically: a Intratec Tec-9

IN THE SUPERIOR COURT OF GUAM <u>DECLARATION</u>

I, RICHELLE Y. CANTO, a duly appointed Assistant Attorney General, aver upon information and belief that the following declaration is true. I have reviewed Guam Police Department (GPD) Reports # 21-19454 and 21-19455 submitted by Officer C.D. Champion (#745), which revealed the following occurred in Guam:

On or about August 13, 2021, at approximately 4:44 a.m., GPD officers executed a pull over of a bronze Toyota Tacoma (GLP #YN1360), which had a 2019 registration decal on the plate. Officers noted that as soon as the driver of the vehicle, CARLOS ROBERT CAMACHO (defendant) rolled his window down, the distinct, pungent, odor of unburnt marijuana wafted out from within the vehicle.

In the passenger seat was a female minor, M.M.T. (DOB: 09/21/2004, 16 years old), and in the back seat was a male individual identified as Phillip Jay Cruz. CAMACHO admitted to officers that the group had smoked marijuana at Capital Bay Hotel earlier that morning, and that he did not possess a driver's license. When officers asked if the vehicle could be searched, CAMACHO said no. The officers did not search the vehicle.

Cruz and M.M.T. were asked to exit the vehicle. When M.M.T. exited from the front passenger seat, officers observed in plain view on the front passenger floorboard a box of "Blazer 0.9mm" ammunition. Upon discovering such ammunition, officers were alerted to the possibility of a firearm within the vehicle.

CAMACHO was advised of his Miranda rights, and then confronted with the fact that ammunition was found within the front passenger floorboard of his vehicle. Officers asked CAMACHO if there was a firearm in the vehicle, and CAMACHO hung his head, and after a moment of silence, admitted that there was a firearm within a gray bag that was inside the vehicle. CAMACHO admitted he did not possess a valid firearm identification card, and gave consent to search the vehicle.

Upon searching the vehicle, officers found a gray bag in the back passenger area, where Cruz had been seated. Within the gray back was a black and silver Intratec Tec-9 0.9mm semi-automatic pistol, a detachable magazine containing unexpended 0.9mm rounds, and a second box of 0.9mm ammunition. Two unexpended 0.9mm rounds were also found underneath the driver's seat. Under the gray bag, officers found a pink pipe with residue that tested presumptive positive for methamphetamines, and a plastic grocery bag containing approximately 1 ounce of marijuana.

M.M.T. told officers she observed CAMACHO carrying the bag containing the firearm out of a room at Capital Bay Hotel earlier that morning. Officers verified CAMACHO did not possess a firearm identification card.

Based on the foregoing, there is probable cause to charge CARLOS ROBERT CAMACHO with one (1) count of POSSESSION OF A FIREARM WITHOUT VALID IDENTIFICATION (as a Third Degree Felony) in violation of 10 G.C.A. §§60106, 60114(a), 60121(e).

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct. Executed this 14th day of August, 2021.
