

IN THE SUPERIOR COURT OF GUAM
DECLARATION

I, RICHELLE Y. CANTO, a duly appointed Assistant Attorney General, aver upon information and belief that the following declaration is true. I have reviewed Guam Police Department (GPD) Reports # 21-22060, #21-22105 and #21-22125 submitted by Officers V.A. Antonio (#640), R.M. Mantanona (#4108), and A.R. Cruz (#4120), which revealed the following occurred in Guam:

On or about September 11, 2021, at approximately 7:50 a.m., GPD officers responded to a physical disturbance at a residence in Agat, Guam. Officers met with [REDACTED] (witness) who stated her son **COREY RICHARD BORJA** (defendant) had assaulted her other son [REDACTED] (victim 1). [REDACTED] indicated she had a "stay away" order that prevented **BORJA** from being at her residence, but she "felt bad" for her son and allowed him to stay overnight at her house. That morning, **BORJA** reportedly became upset at [REDACTED] because [REDACTED] could not take him to apply for employment due to his having to go to work. **BORJA** placed [REDACTED] in a "headlock" and only after [REDACTED] called for help did **BORJA** release [REDACTED] however, **BORJA** then grabbed [REDACTED] by his neck and shoved him up against the trunk of his vehicle. Officers noted redness on [REDACTED] neck, on his right rear shoulder, and right upper back area. [REDACTED] statement corroborated [REDACTED]

Officers located **BORJA** but were unable to arrest him because he fled and successfully evaded arrest.

On the same day, at approximately 5:49 p.m., GPD officers noticed **BORJA** walking away from a residence in Santa Rita, Guam. Officers observed [REDACTED] (victim 2) angrily yelling at **BORJA** from her driveway. [REDACTED] is **BORJA**'s stepmother. [REDACTED] told officers **BORJA** had unexpectedly showed up at her residence between 9-10:00 a.m. that morning for no reason, and that he "just arrives unexpectedly at times." [REDACTED] stated **BORJA** did yard work with his father and brothers, and sometime in the late afternoon, [REDACTED] told **BORJA** that "he can stop" doing yardwork. However, **BORJA** swung his bush cutter at [REDACTED] while it was still on and the whip end was spinning. [REDACTED] stated she stepped back to avoid getting hurt and yelled at him to stop. **BORJA** then yelled at her, "I'm gonna call my mom to fuckin (sic) beat you up and kill you!" Officers noted a red and gray "Shindawa" brand bush cutter on the premises, identified by [REDACTED] as the bush cutter **BORJA** used.

Officers arrested **BORJA** and transported him to Central Precinct to be processed. During the intake, while handcuffs were being adjusted so he could sign a medical form, **BORJA** again fled from the police and an All Points Bulletin was issued.


The next day, on or about September 12, 2021, at approximately 11:29 p.m., officers received a call from [REDACTED] who stated her son **BORJA** came home and started smoking a "joint" in her living room. She stated she knows this is for **BORJA**'s "own good and that she just wants him to get help."

BORJA is on pretrial release in CF0422-21, where he was ordered by the Honorable Benjamin C. Sison to have no contact and stay away from [REDACTED] his mother, and not to harass, assault, or threaten any family household members.

Based on the foregoing, there is probable cause to charge **COREY RICHARD BORJA** with the following:

1. Two (2) counts of **FAMILY VIOLENCE** (as a Misdemeanor), in violation of Title 9 G.C.A. §30.10(a)(1) and 30.20(a) - as to victims [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]
2. Two (2) counts of **VIOLATION OF A COURT ORDER** (as a Misdemeanor), in violation of Title 9 G.C.A. §30.40(a)(1) - as to victims [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]
3. Two (2) counts of **VIOLATION OF A COURT ORDER** (as a Misdemeanor), in violation of Title 9 G.C.A. §30.40(a)(2) - as to victim [REDACTED] on September 11 and 12, 2021; and
4. One (1) count of **ORDINARY ESCAPE** (as a Misdemeanor), in violation of Title 9 G.C.A. § 58.30 - on September 12, 2021.

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.
