MAGISTRATE'S COMPLAINT

ORIGINAL

1 The Attorney General of Guam hereby accuses **WILLIAM JAY TAIMANGLO** (*aka*
2 **William Jay Robert Mitchell Taimanglo, aka William Jay Taimanglo, Jr.**) of certain crimes
3 committed as follows:
4

5 **FIRST CHARGE**

6 On or about the 8th day of April, 2021, in Guam, **WILLIAM JAY TAIMANGLO** (*aka*
7 **William Jay Robert Mitchell Taimanglo, aka William Jay Taimanglo, Jr.**) did commit the
8 offense of *Home Invasion (As a 1st Degree Felony)*, in that he did commit a *Burglary* by entering
9 the dwelling of [REDACTED] at a time when the premises was neither open to the public nor
10 was defendant licensed or privileged to so enter, with the intent to commit a crime therein, and when
11 [REDACTED] who was not a participant in the burglary, was actually present inside the
12 dwelling, and, in the course of committing the burglary **WILLIAM JAY TAIMANGLO** (*aka*
13 **William Jay Robert Mitchell Taimanglo, aka William Jay Taimanglo, Jr.**) was armed with a
14 deadly weapon or a dangerous instrument, *to wit: a knife*, in violation of 9 GCA §§ 37.210(b) and
15 37.240.

18 ***SPECIAL ALLEGATION:***

19 ***Deadly Weapon Used in Commission of a Felony***

20 On or about the 8th day of April, 2021, in Guam, **WILLIAM JAY**
21 **TAIMANGLO** (*aka William Jay Robert Mitchell Taimanglo, aka William Jay*
22 **Taimanglo, Jr.**) did knowingly and unlawfully use a deadly weapon, *that is: a knife*,
23 in the commission of a felony, *that is: Home Invasion (As a 1st Degree Felony)*, in
24 violation of 9 GCA § 80.37.

1 **SECOND CHARGE**

2 On or about the period between March 11, 2021 and October 21, 2021, *inclusive*, in Guam,
3 **WILLIAM JAY TAIMANGLO** (*aka William Jay Robert Mitchell Taimanglo, aka William Jay*
4 **Taimanglo, Jr.**) did commit the offense of *Advanced Stalking (As a 2nd Degree Felony)*, in that he
5 did willfully, maliciously, and repeatedly, follow or harass another person, *specifically*: [REDACTED]
6 [REDACTED], or made a credible threat with intent to place [REDACTED] or a member of her
7 immediate family in fear of death or bodily injury when there is a temporary restraining order or an
8 injunction or both or any other court order in effect prohibiting said behavior against [REDACTED]
9 [REDACTED] in violation of 9 GCA § 19.70(a), (b) and (e).

12 **THIRD CHARGE**

13 On or about the 8th day of April, 2021, in Guam, **WILLIAM JAY TAIMANGLO** (*aka*
14 **William Jay Robert Mitchell Taimanglo, aka William Jay Taimanglo, Jr.**) did commit the
15 offense of *Burglary (As a 2nd Degree Felony)*, in that he did enter or surreptitiously remain in the
16 habitable property, building, or a separately secured or occupied portion thereof of [REDACTED]
17 [REDACTED], with intent to commit the crime of *harassment* therein, at a time when the premises were
18 neither open to the public nor the Defendant licensed or privileged to so enter in, in violation of
19 9 GCA § 37.20(a) and (b), as amended.
20

21 **FOURTH CHARGE**

22 On or about the 10th day of June, 2021, in Guam, **WILLIAM JAY TAIMANGLO** (*aka*
23 **William Jay Robert Mitchell Taimanglo, aka William Jay Taimanglo, Jr.**) did commit the
24 offense of *Attempted Burglary (As a 2nd Degree Felony)*, in that he did attempt to enter or
25 surreptitiously remain in the habitable property, building, or a separately secured or occupied portion
26 thereof of [REDACTED] with intent to commit the crime of *harassment* therein, at a time when
27

1 the premises were neither open to the public nor the Defendant licensed or privileged to so enter in,
2 in violation of 9 GCA § 37.20(a) and (b), as amended, 13.10, and 13.60.

3 **FIFTH CHARGE**

4
5 On or about the 4th day of April, 2021, in Guam, **WILLIAM JAY TAIMANGLO** (*aka*
6 **William Jay Robert Mitchell Taimanglo, aka William Jay Taimanglo, Jr.**) did commit the
7 offense of *Family Violence (As a 3rd Degree Felony)*, in that he did recklessly cause or attempt to
8 cause bodily injury to another family member or household member, *that is:* [REDACTED], in
9 violation of 9 GCA §§ 30.10(a)(1) and 30.20(a).

10 **SIXTH CHARGE**

11
12 On or about the 11th day of March, 2021, in Guam, **WILLIAM JAY TAIMANGLO** (*aka*
13 **William Jay Robert Mitchell Taimanglo, aka William Jay Taimanglo, Jr.**) did commit the
14 offense of *Criminal Mischief (As a 3rd Degree Felony)*, in that he did intentionally damage the
15 motor vehicle of another, *to wit:* a 2001 Ford Expedition, belonging to [REDACTED], in
16 violation of 9 GCA §§ 34.50(d) and 34.60(a), as amended.

17 **SEVENTH CHARGE**

18 **Count One**

20 On or about the 11th day of March, 2021, in Guam, **WILLIAM JAY TAIMANGLO** (*aka*
21 **William Jay Robert Mitchell Taimanglo, aka William Jay Taimanglo, Jr.**) did commit the

13 **Mitchell Taimanglo, aka William Jay Taimanglo, Jr.)** did commit the offense of *Violation of a*
14 *Court Order (As a Misdemeanor)*, in that he knowingly violated a court order filed on December
15 26, 2018 in the Superior Court of Guam Criminal Case No. CM0627-18 or an order filed on
16 December 17, 2019, in the Superior Court of Guam Criminal Case No. CM0424-19, orders in a
17 criminal case prohibiting the defendant from harassing, annoying, telephoning, contacting, or
18 otherwise communicating with [REDACTED] either directly or indirectly, in violation of 9 GCA
19 § 30.40(a)(5).
20

21 **Count Six**

22 On or about the 10th day of June, 2021, in Guam, **WILLIAM JAY TAIMANGLO (aka**
23 **William Jay Robert Mitchell Taimanglo, aka William Jay Taimanglo, Jr.)** did commit the
24 offense of *Violation of a Court Order (As a Misdemeanor)*, in that he knowingly violated a court
25 order filed on December 26, 2018 in the Superior Court of Guam Criminal Case No. CM0627-18

18 On or about the 8th day of April, 2021, in Guam, **WILLIAM JAY TAIMANGLO** (*aka*

20 offense of *Harassment (As a Petty Misdemeanor)*, in that, with the intent to harass another, he did
21 engage in any other course of alarming conduct or of repeatedly committed acts which alarmed or
22 seriously annoyed [REDACTED] and served no legitimate purpose of **WILLIAM JAY**
23 **TAIMANGLO** (*aka William Jay Robert Mitchell Taimanglo, aka William Jay Taimanglo, Jr.*),
24 in violation of 9 GCA § 61.20(c).

Count Two

On or about the 21st day of October, 2021, in Guam, **WILLIAM JAY TAIMANGLO** (*aka William Jay Robert Mitchell Taimanglo, aka William Jay Taimanglo, Jr.*) did commit the offense of *Harassment (As a Petty Misdemeanor)*, in that, with the intent to harass another, he did engage in any other course of alarming conduct or of repeatedly committed acts which alarmed or seriously annoyed [REDACTED] and served no legitimate purpose of **WILLIAM JAY TAIMANGLO** (*aka William Jay Robert Mitchell Taimanglo, aka William Jay Taimanglo, Jr.*), in violation of 9 GCA § 61.20(c).

DECLARATION

COMES NOW, Jeremiah B. Luther, a duly appointed Assistant Attorney General, and aver upon information and belief, that the following is true and correct to the best of my knowledge:

I have reviewed Guam Police Report Nos. 21-6183, 21-6184, 21-8302, 21-8303, 21-8518, 21-8552, 21-14002, 21-24837, 21-25929 submitted by officers of the Guam Police Department ("GPD"), which sets forth the following events occurred on Guam:

On December 26, 2018, **WILLIAM JAY TAIMANGLO** (*aka*: William Jay Robert Mitchell Taimanglo, William Jay Taimanglo, Jr. (dob: 11-03-1985) (Defendant) signed an Order of Conditional Release and Appearance Bond in **CM0627-18**. This document orders Taimanglo to "stay away from, and have no contact with. . . [REDACTED]. . . Defendant shall stay away from the victim(s), his/her/their residence, dwelling. . ." and "Defendant is restrained from threatening to commit or committing acts of family violence against, or from harassing, annoying, or molesting the victim(s), or other family or household members. . ." This Order was signed by Magistrate Judge Jonathan R. Quan.

On October 15, 2019, Superior Court Judge Vernon P. Perez issued an Order of Protection in PO 0113-19. This Order prohibits Taimanglo from "coming within 500 feet of those protected on page 1, such as their residence, place of employment, and school. . ." [REDACTED] and six of her children are listed on page 1 of the Order as the protected parties. The Order finds that Taimanglo "failed to appear at the OSC hearing after being properly served and noticed; thus, the case may proceed by default."

On December 17, 2019, Taimanglo signed an Order of Conditional Release and Appearance Bond in **CM0424-19**. This document orders Taimanglo to "stay away from, and have no contact with. . . [REDACTED]. . . Defendant shall stay away from the victim(s), his/her/their residence, dwelling. . ." and "Defendant is restrained from threatening to commit or committing acts of family violence against, or from harassing, annoying, or molesting the victim(s), or other family or household members. . ." This Order was signed by Superior Court Judge Vernon P. Perez.

It is upon a good faith belief that this author states that: Both of the aforementioned criminal cases were in a pre-trial status and both Orders of Conditional Release applicable to the Defendant during all of the events described herein.

On or about March 11, 2021 at approximately 6:49 pm, GPD officers received a criminal mischief complaint at a residence in Yona. Officers arrived and spoke with [REDACTED] (victim). [REDACTED] told officers that at approximately 9:30 am, the father of her children, Taimanglo, knocked on the door of her residence. She answered and spoke with him. Taimanglo asked if he could come inside her residence and, because she was scared of his reaction if she refused, [REDACTED] let him in. She left Taimanglo in the house and took her children to a medical appointment. When [REDACTED] returned, and before she could enter her residence, Taimanglo asked her for a ride. He got into [REDACTED]'s 2001 Ford Expedition. During the trip, Taimanglo and [REDACTED] argued about their relationship. Taimanglo punched the rearview mirror and it broke. Taimanglo then punched the front windshield and it cracked. During the arguments, Taimanglo remarked to [REDACTED] that "You're going to pay for it" which she didn't understand at the time. [REDACTED] eventually dropped Taimanglo near a beach in Agat.

When [REDACTED] returned home, she found that Taimanglo had ransacked her apartment and written messages in markers and crayons on her walls. She called for police, since her residence is covered by GHURA housing.

An officer investigated [REDACTED]'s car and found both the rear-view windshield missing and a crack in the front windshield in which the officer viewed suspected blood. The officer viewed messages on the inside of [REDACTED]'s residence, written on her walls, that appeared to reference [REDACTED] and Taimanglo's relationship.

An interview of one of [REDACTED]'s children corroborated [REDACTED]'s report.

An All Points Bulletin was issued for Taimanglo.

On or about April 5, 2021, at approximately 8:00pm GPD responded to [REDACTED]'s residence. She had called police reporting that her back door was open and she was worried that someone was burglarizing her

residence. Police responded and found the back door open. While investigating at the back of the residence, the police heard the intruder exit the front door and flee. The intruder could not be located. [REDACTED] inspected the residence and found Taimanglo's slippers inside.

While speaking to GPD regarding the burglary, [REDACTED] reported that on or about April 4, 2021 at approximately 7:00 am, she was inside her residence when Taimanglo knocked on the door. He asked to enter and for something to eat. [REDACTED] told officers that she is scared of Taimanglo whenever comes around and that she did not want to ruin the Easter holiday for her children by calling police, so she let Taimanglo inside. After about an hour, [REDACTED] noticed that Taimanglo was holding her cell phone. She asked for it back and he refused, telling her that he was going to hold on it so that she couldn't call the police on him. Taimanglo demanded that [REDACTED] give him the keys to [REDACTED]'s car. She refused and attempted to walk out the back door. Taimanglo pulled [REDACTED] back inside, she resisted by grabbing the door frame, Taimanglo responded by grabbing her wrist and body slamming her on the kitchen floor. She tried to call out for help but had trouble breathing. Taimanglo picked her up by the neck and pulled her into the living room where he pushed her head into the couch so that she couldn't scream. Taimanglo then dragged [REDACTED] into the bedroom and began hitting her in the back. This attracted the attention of one of her sons who came into the bedroom and told Taimanglo to stop hitting his mom. Taimanglo threw the phone down and walked out of the residence. An officer observed bruising to the back of [REDACTED]'s neck, her left shoulder, the middle of her back, and her left thigh area. A search of the interior of the house revealed that a bedroom window lock had been broken.

On or about April 8, 2021, at approximately 8:40 am, GPD responded to [REDACTED]'s residence. She reported that at approximately 8:15 am, she heard knocking on her kitchen window and Taimanglo's voice asking to be let in. She and her children remained quiet in the hopes that Taimanglo would go away. Eventually he did, but he left a note on her front door. Police responded and attempted to locate Taimanglo, but were unable. At approximately 12:00 pm that same date, [REDACTED] was forced to call police again because Taimanglo returned and spoke with [REDACTED]. He again escaped detection by running into the jungle area near [REDACTED]'s residence.

On or about April 8, 2021, at approximately 4:42 pm, GPD once again responded to [REDACTED]'s residence. [REDACTED] reported that Taimanglo returned and knocked on her back door. He was sweating and wanted food and water. She did not give him permission to enter. She brought food and water to him while he was standing outside. When she opened the door, Taimanglo forced his hands into the door and fought with [REDACTED] as she tried to close the door. Eventually he forced his way inside. He grabbed a knife in the kitchen and threatened to harm himself in front of [REDACTED] and her children. She pleaded with him to leave. After approximately ten minutes, Taimanglo left. A neighbor was interviewed. She told police that she was outside doing laundry when she saw Taimanglo force his way inside [REDACTED]'s residence.

On or about June 10, 2021, at approximately 2:02 am, GPD responded to [REDACTED]'s residence. Officers immediately noticed a male, standing next to a vehicle parked in the roadway. The male fled and an officer chased, however the male evaded capture.

[REDACTED] reported that the male who fled was Taimanglo. She told officers that at approximately 2:00 am, that same date, she and her children were woken up by Taimanglo knocking on the bedroom window and asking to be let in. Taimanglo told [REDACTED] that he wanted to talk. When [REDACTED] refused, Taimanglo pushed the window mounted air conditioner out of the window frame and onto the bedroom floor. He tried to force himself into the residence, but [REDACTED] told him she would call the police and he left. He returned moments later in the aforementioned vehicle and parked it in front of the house. An officer observed the air conditioner lying on the floor of the bedroom.

On or about October 10, 2021, at approximately 10:59 am, GPD responded to the residence of [REDACTED] (Witness). [REDACTED] is [REDACTED]'s sister. [REDACTED]'s residence is different from [REDACTED]'s residence. [REDACTED] told police that at approximately 10:00 am, she noticed Taimanglo outside her residence. She walked outside, told him that [REDACTED] was not inside, and told him to leave. Taimanglo told [REDACTED] that he knew [REDACTED] was inside and that he wanted to speak with her. [REDACTED] told Taimanglo that she would call the police and he left. [REDACTED] then took [REDACTED] to work and returned home. When she arrived, Taimanglo was again outside of [REDACTED]'s residence. [REDACTED] told him to leave and Taimanglo refused. [REDACTED] called police and Taimanglo fled when they arrived.

On or about October 21, 2021, at approximately 2:00 pm GPD responded to a possible burglary at [REDACTED]'s residence. When officers arrived, they found Taimanglo inside the apartment and he was arrested. [REDACTED] was interviewed. She reported that she returned to her apartment to find that the door lock was unlocked and her deadbolt lock engaged. She became worried. When [REDACTED] left the residence, she locked the door handle and left the deadbolt unlocked. A search of the residence revealed that the kitchen window was broken. A screwdriver, possibly used to break the window, was located nearby.


Taimanglo invoked his right to silence.

Based on the foregoing, there is probable cause to charge **WILLIAM JAY TAIMANGLO** (*aka*: William Jay Robert Mitchell Taimanglo, William Jay Taimanglo, Jr. (dob: 11-03-1985) (Defendant) with:

- ***Home Invasion** (1st Deg Felony), in violation of 9 GCA §§ 37.210(b), 37.240;
 - **Special Allegation: Deadly Weapon Used in Commission of a Felony*, pursuant to 9 GCA § 80.37;
- ***Advanced Stalking** (2nd Deg Felony), in violation of 9 GCA § 19.70(a), (b), (e);
- ***Burglary** (2nd Deg Felony), in violation of 9 GCA § 37.20(a), (b);
- ***Attempted Burglary** (2nd Deg Felony), in violation of 9 GCA §§ 37.20(a), (b), 13.10, 13.60;
- ***Family Violence** (3rd Deg Felony), in violation of 9 GCA §§ 30.10(a)(1), 30.20(a);
- ***Criminal Mischief** (3rd Deg Felony), in violation of 9 GCA §§ 34.50(d), 34.60(a);
- ***Violation of a Court Order** (Misdemeanor) (7 counts), in violation of 9 GCA § 30.40(a)(5)
- ***Harassment** (Petty Misdemeanor) (2 counts), in violation of 61.20(c);

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.
