A HOUSE RESOLUTION

Impeaching Ralph Deleon Guerrero Torres, Governor of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, pursuant to Article II, Section 8 of the Constitution of the Commonwealth for commission of felonies, corruption, and neglect of duty, in violation of Article III, Section 19 of the Constitution of the Commonwealth.

1 WHEREAS, Article II, Section 8 of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, titled "Impeachment," provides in relevant part 2 3 that "[t]he legislature may impeach those executive officers of the Commonwealth 4 subject to impeachment under this Constitution. The house of representatives may initiate impeachment proceedings by the affirmative vote of two-thirds of its 5 members and the senate may convict after hearing by the affirmative vote of two-6 7 thirds of its members"; and WHEREAS, Article III, Section 19 of the Constitution of the 8 9 Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, titled "Impeachment," provides in relevant part that the governor is "subject to impeachment as provided in article 10 11 II, section 8, of this Constitution for treason, commission of a felony, corruption or 12 neglect of duty"; and

1	WHEREAS, the House of Representatives adopted House Resolution 22-
2	1 on January 11, 2021, thereby establishing the Judiciary and Governmental
3	Operations Committee ("JGO") as both a standing and investigatory committee that
4	was authorized, by Article II, Section 14 (b) of the CNMI Constitution, "to compel
5	the attendance and testimony of witnesses," by Title 1, Section 1301 et seq., of the
6	Commonwealth Code, "to issue subpoenas requiring the attendance of witnesses
7	and subpoenas duces tecum requiring the production of books, documents, and
8	other evidence, in any matter pending before either house or a committee," and by
9	House Rule VII, Section 3, to summon and examine witnesses, search and examine
10	records, and provide that "everything shall be done to bring all facts pertaining to
11	the matter before the House"; and

WHEREAS, House Rule VII, Section 3 provides that "[e]ach committee of the House is . . . authorized to study and analyze all facts relating to the subject which would fall within its jurisdiction as indicated by the Rules, including necessary revision of existing laws, other legislation relating to such subjects, investigate the need for legislation in a particular area, and to oversee activities carried out pursuant to laws regarding such subjects, and for such purposes shall constitute an investigating committee," and Speaker Edmund S. Villagomez on June 3, 2021, referred to the JGO a memorandum "to review and conduct any and all investigations relating to" House Communication 22-19, "Report on the Public Expenditures of Governor Ralph Deleon Guerrero Torres: Violations of Law, Areas

1	of Abuse, and Recommendations for Oversight and Reform," and the JGO
2	investigation pursuant to that referral brought to light further evidence of the
3	Governor's waste and abuse of public funds;
4	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Ralph Deleon Guerrero
5	Torres, Governor of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, is hereby
6	impeached pursuant to Article II, Section 8 of the Constitution of the
7	Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands for the commission of felonies,
8	corruption, and neglect of duty, in violation of Article III, Section 19 of the
9	Constitution of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, and that the
10	following articles of impeachment be exhibited to the Commonwealth Senate for
11	trial; and
12	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Speaker of the House of
13	Representatives shall certify, and the House Clerk shall attest, to the adoption of
14	this resolution and thereafter the House Clerk shall transmit a certified copy to the
15	Honorable Jude U. Hofschneider, Senate President, the 22 nd Northern Marianas
16	Commonwealth Legislature, and Ralph Deleon Guerrero Torres, Governor,
17	Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands.
18	These articles of impeachment are hereby exhibited, debated and adopted
19	by the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana
20	Islands in the name of itself and of the people of the Commonwealth of the Northern
21	Mariana Islands, against Ralph Deleon Guerrero Torres, Governor of the

1	Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, in support of its impeachment
2	against him for commission of felonies, corruption, and neglect of duty.

ARTICLE I: COMMISSION OF FELONY

THEFT OF UTILITY SERVICES

In his conduct while Governor of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, Ralph Deleon Guerrero Torres, in violation of his constitutional oath to faithfully discharge his duties as Governor and, to the best of his ability support and defend the Constitution and laws of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, and in violation of his constitutional responsibility to faithfully execute the laws, has willfully committed a felony against the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, to wit:

Ralph Deleon Guerrero Torres utilized his position as Governor of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands to commit Theft of Utility Services in violation of Title 6, Section 1609 of the Commonwealth Code, by unjustly and without legal authorization obtaining in excess of \$177,000.00 in taxpayer-funded utility benefits from the Commonwealth Utilities Corporation for his privately-owned residences during the period February 2015 through August 2021, to include exorbitant utility expenses associated with the commercial piggery that was operating on his residential property, and further requested and received unjust utility benefits for at least two residences at the same time, in As Teo and in Koblerville, for a period of approximately 16 months. Theft of Utility Services in

excess of \$20,000.00 is punishable pursuant to Title 6, section 1609(d)(1) of the
Commonwealth Code, by imprisonment of not more than 10 years and a fine of not
more than \$10,000.00, or both. Even assuming arguendo that Governor Torres was
authorized to receive the benefit of taxpayer-paid utilities at his private estate
pursuant to the Department of Finance's interpretation of Title 1, Section 8222 of
the Commonwealth Code, which provides for government housing for the
Governor and other key elected officials, the law does not explicitly authorize the
payment of utilities at said properties. Furthermore, no law nor any regulation or
policy of the Department of Finance provides the taxpayer-funded benefit of
utilities at two or more residential properties or multiple accounts at the same time
for any elected official.

Wherefore, Ralph Deleon Guerrero Torres, by such conduct warrants impeachment and trial, and removal from office and disqualification to hold and enjoy any office of honor or trust of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands.

ARTICLE II: COMMISSION OF FELONY

THEFT

In his conduct while Governor of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, Ralph Deleon Guerrero Torres, in violation of his constitutional oath to faithfully discharge his duties as Governor and, to the best of his ability support and defend the Constitution and laws of the Commonwealth of the Northern

1	Mariana Islands, and in violation of his constitutional responsibility to faithfully
2	execute the laws, has willfully committed multiple felonies against the
3	Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, to wit:
4	Count 1. Ralph Deleon Guerrero Torres, between April 28, 2018 to May 8,
5	2018, utilized his position as Governor of the Commonwealth of the Northern
6	Mariana Islands to commit Theft in violation of Title 6, Section 1601(a) of the
7	Commonwealth Code, by unlawfully and fraudulently taking public funds to obtain
8	airfare, stipend, and lodging to attend a political campaign event in the State of
9	Oregon on or about April 30, 2018. Governor Torres' trip to attend a campaign rally
10	in Oregon, which included first-class and business-class airfare for himself and his
11	spouse, Mrs. Diann Tudela Torres, as well as one day of stipend and a one-night
12	stay in a hotel on or about April 29, 2018 to April 30, 2018, cost CNMI taxpayers
13	approximately \$16,559.41.
14	Count 2. Ralph Deleon Guerrero Torres, between June 22, 2018 to June 24,
15	2018, utilized his position as Governor of the Commonwealth of the Northern
16	Mariana Islands to commit Theft in violation of Title 6, Section 1601(a) of the
17	Commonwealth Code, by unlawfully and fraudulently taking public funds to obtain
18	airfare, stipend, and lodging to attend a political campaign event in the Territory of
19	Guam on or about June 23, 2018. Governor Torres' trip to attend a campaign rally
20	on Guam, which included business-class airfare, one day of stipend, and a one-night

stay in a hotel on or about June 23, 2018 to June 24, 2018, cost CNMI taxpayers approximately \$6,036.70.

Count 3. Ralph Deleon Guerrero Torres, on or about September 15, 2017 in the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, on the island of Saipan, utilized his position as Governor of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands to commit Theft in violation of Title 6, Section 1601(a) of the Commonwealth Code, by unlawfully taking public funds to reimburse himself for fuel in the amount of \$919.10 that he fraudulently claimed was for the benefit of a Department of Public Safety vessel. Evidence obtained from testimony made under oath during the JGO investigatory hearings revealed that DPS vessels routinely utilized for the Governor's personal security detail are refueled at Shell gas station in Puerto Rico and there was no evidence found to support the notion that that the Governor personally refueled any DPS vessels at that or any time at a Mobil gas station.

Count 4. Ralph Deleon Guerrero Torres, on or about September 15, 2017 to September 17, 2017, in the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, on the island of Rota, utilized his position as Governor of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands to commit Theft in violation of Title 6, section 1601(a) of the Commonwealth Code, by unlawfully and fraudulently taking public funds to obtain reimbursement for himself for lodging expenses totaling \$690.00. These expenses included a room under the name of Governor Torres, despite his having

1	received a per diem to cover such expenses; a room under the name of his wife,
2	Mrs. Diann Tudela Torres, a non-government employee; and a room under the
3	name of police officer Adrian Mendiola, who subsequently testified under oath that
4	he had received a per diem for this trip and used it to pay for his own lodging.

Each Theft is punishable pursuant to Title 6, Section 1601(b)(2) of the Commonwealth Code by imprisonment of up to five years.

Wherefore, Ralph Deleon Guerrero Torres, by such conduct warrants impeachment and trial, and removal from office and disqualification to hold and enjoy any office of honor or trust of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands.

ARTICLE III: CORRUPTION

UNLAWFUL FIRST-CLASS AND BUSINESS-CLASS TRAVEL

In his conduct while Governor of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, Ralph Deleon Guerrero Torres, in violation of his constitutional oath to faithfully discharge his duties as Governor and, to the best of his ability support and defend the Constitution and laws of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, and in violation of his constitutional responsibility to faithfully execute the laws, has willfully engaged in corruption, in that he committed multiple acts against the interests of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, with the intent to give some advantage inconsistent with his duties of office and the rights of others, to wit:

1	Ralph Deleon Guerrero Torres, between January 2016 through December
2	2019, utilized his position as Governor of the Commonwealth of the Northern
3	Mariana Islands to cause at least 54 first-class and/or business-class airline tickets
4	to be furnished to himself and/or his spouse, Mrs. Diann Tudela Torres, a non-
5	government employee, in violation of Title 1, Section 7407 of the Commonwealth
6	Code, which is punishable pursuant to Title 1, Section 7407(f) of the
7	Commonwealth Code, by a civil penalty of \$1,000.00 per violation. Further, in
8	requesting and approving Mrs. Torres' travel at government expense, Governor
9	Torres used his position in violation of Title 1, Section 3202 of the Commonwealth
10	Code, Misconduct in Office; Title 1, Section 7705, Public Purpose Requirement;
11	and Department of Finance regulations at Title 70, Chapter 70-20.1-101(b) of the
12	Northern Marianas Administrative Code, which prohibit the use of public funds for
13	non-public purposes, including travel expenditures for non-government employees.
14	Wherefore, Ralph Deleon Guerrero Torres, by such conduct warrants
15	impeachment and trial, and removal from office and disqualification to hold and
16	enjoy any office of honor or trust of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana
17	Islands.
18	ARTICLE IV: CORRUPTION
19	MISUSE OF GOVERNMENT RESOURCES
20	In his conduct while Governor of the Commonwealth of the Northern
21	Mariana Islands, Ralph Deleon Guerrero Torres, in violation of his constitutional

oath to faithfully discharge his duties as Governor and, to the best of his ability support and defend the Constitution and laws of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, has willfully engaged in corruption, in that he committed multiple acts against the interests of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, with the intent to give some advantage inconsistent with his duties of office and the rights of others, to wit:

Count 1. Ralph Deleon Guerrero Torres, on or about December 2015 through December 2019, utilized his position as Governor of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, to unlawfully and fraudulently request and obtain reimbursements for expenditures that include lavish hostings of individuals both named and unnamed, such as one dinner with a Washington, DC lobbyist that cost taxpayers \$1,823.90, and a single breakfast that cost more than \$399.00; a car battery for Governor Torres' personal van for which he subsequently transferred ownership; meals featuring extravagant items such as wagyu and bison tomahawk steak, king crab, prime rib, and foie gras; expensive scotch whiskey and other alcohol; a private birthday lunch that he claimed as a meeting; and various items for a non-public purpose that he claimed as office expenses, such as rifle cases, a personal stove burner, beef stroganoff and other goods for hunting or camping; wheelbarrow, chainsaw, mattocks, and other hardware supplies; coolers; and multiple electronics, including cameras, headphones, and computers, items that were not properly inventoried at the Office of the Governor nor used for public

1	purposes. These excessive expenditures lacked sufficient justification, were made
2	during times of natural disaster, austerity, and furloughs, and exceeded \$78,000.
3	Count 2. Ralph Deleon Guerrero Torres, between May 27, 2017 and July
4	11, 2021, utilized his position as Governor of the Commonwealth of the Northern
5	Mariana Islands, to request and/or approve 85 boating trips using scarce
6	Department of Public Safety resources, including personnel, vessels, vehicles, fuel,
7	and public funds, in a manner inconsistent with public purposes. Many of these
8	boating trips were for fishing or recreation with members of Governor Torres'
9	family, to the Northern Islands, Tinian, Rota, Managaha, and Guam, during times
0	of natural disaster, austerity, furloughs, and pandemic.
1	These acts of corruption constitute violations of Title 1, Section 8531 of the
2	Commonwealth Code, Use of Office, Staff or Employees of Public Office; Title 1,
3	Section 8532 of the Commonwealth Code, Restraints on Use of Public Position to
4	Obtain Private Benefit; Title 1, Section 7705 of the Commonwealth Code, Public
5	Purpose Requirement; and Title 6, Section 3202, Misconduct in Office.
6	Wherefore, Ralph Deleon Guerrero Torres, by such conduct warrants
7	impeachment and trial, and removal from office and disqualification to hold and
8	enjoy any office of honor or trust of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana
9	Islands.
20	ARTICLE V: NEGLECT OF DUTY
) 1	NEGLIGENCE DURING CRISIS

While Governor of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands,
Ralph Deleon Guerrero Torres, in violation of his constitutional oath to faithfully
discharge his duties as Governor, and in violation of his constitutional duty to take
care that the laws be faithfully executed, has willfully neglected the duties of his
office, to wit:

Ralph Deleon Guerrero Torres, between December 2015 and July 2021, grossly neglected his duties and responsibilities as Governor of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, by taking over 120 trips by plane for himself and/or his spouse, Mrs. Diann Tudela Torres, a non-government employee, and approximately 85 trips by boat. This dereliction of duty occurred during times of natural disaster, austerity, furloughs, and pandemic. In one year following Super Typhoon Yutu, Governor Torres and Mrs. Torres took at least 16 governmentfunded trips, during which time Governor Torres neglected his duties of office while dining and shopping extravagantly at taxpayer expense. Commonwealth residents meanwhile suffered without adequate shelter, power, or running water and struggled to rebuild their lives and homes.

In the summer of 2020, in the midst of the Covid-19 pandemic, after the local economy ground to a halt and thousands of residents in the public and private sectors lost work, Governor Torres further neglected his duties when he embarked on a three-week fishing and hunting promotional expedition to the Northern Islands with his family and friends. Instead of addressing the ongoing public health

emergency, Governor Torres negligently directed various government agencies to
procure charter boats, meals, fuel, and other supplies, and utilized police officers
and other government personnel, and government vessels, vehicles, generators, and
other equipment and materials.
In total, these numerous and excessive trips by air and by sea, directed
and/or authorized by Governor Torres over nearly six years, cost CNMI taxpayers
over \$550,000.00. This amount includes airfare, lodging, ground transportation,
fuel, per diem and stipends, and other supplies, but does not encompass all the
travel-related expenses of protective security officers and other government
employees who accompanied Governor Torres and his family members on these
trips. This amount also does not include the cost of Governor Torres' negligent
conduct to the safety and welfare of the people of the Commonwealth in times of
crisis.
Wherefore, Ralph Deleon Guerrero Torres, by such neglect of duty warrants
impeachment and trial, and removal from office and disqualification to hold and
enjoy any office of honor or trust of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana
Islands.

ARTICLE VI: NEGLECT OF DUTY

CONTEMPT OF THE LEGISLATURE

While Governor of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, Ralph Deleon Guerrero Torres, in violation of his constitutional oath to faithfully discharge his duties as Governor and in violation of his constitutional duty to take care that the laws be faithfully executed, has willfully neglected the duties of his office, to wit:

Governor Ralph Deleon Guerrero Torres, having a duty to honor and respect the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands Constitution, the laws of the Commonwealth, and the applicable Rules of the Twenty Second House of Representatives, breached said duty by failing to appear as commanded on December 10, 2021 at 10:30 am by a legislative subpoena duly served upon him and constitutionally authorized by Article II Section 14 (b) of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands Constitution, and Title 1, Sections 1301 et seq. of the Commonwealth Code, before the House Standing Committee on Judiciary and Governmental Operations. Said failure to appear was adjudged to be in contempt of the Legislature pursuant to Title 1, Section 1306 (b) of the Commonwealth Code by a unanimous vote of the House Standing Committee on Judiciary and Governmental Operations on December 14, 2021, after Governor Torres failed to cure his contempt by refusing an invitation to testify under oath voluntarily pursuant to Title 1, Section 1309 of the Commonwealth Code and cooperate with the investigatory committee's attempt to obtain information by lawful means. The House Speaker certified the contempt charge to the CNMI Office of the Attorney General on December 15, 2021 for prosecution.

1	Wherefore, Ralph Deleon Guerrero Torres, by such neglect of duty warrants
2	impeachment and trial, and removal from office and disqualification to hold and
3	enjoy any office of honor or trust of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana
4	Islands.
5	DEMAND FOR IMPEACHMENT
6	Wherefore, Ralph Deleon Guerrero Torres, by commission of felonies,
7	corruption, and neglect of duty, having undermined the integrity of his office and
8	brought disrepute on the Governorship, having betrayed the trust of those he swore
9	to serve, having acted in a manner subversive of the rule of law and justice, to the
0	manifest injury of the people of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana
1	Islands, legally warrants impeachment and trial, and removal from office and
2	disqualification to hold and enjoy any office of honor or trust of the Commonwealth
3	of the Northern Mariana Islands.
