The imminent shaking of the entire establishment

I'd be more concerned about Felix Camacho if I were Lou Leon Guerrero at this stage. She should assume Michael San Nicolas will challenge her for the Democratic Party nomination for governor this year. Granted, San Nicolas will enter the race as the frontrunner; but the exceedingly popular congressman won't enter the arena swinging, as Camacho has done.

He doesn't need to; and it's likely not a single negative utterance will leave his lips about his opponents's character throughout the entire campaign. It's not his style.

Camacho, on the other hand, already challenged Ms. Leon Guerrero's credibility and ability to withstand criticism. He announced he's running for governor essentially to overturn her pandemic policies. Within hours, the Democratic Party of Guam hit back ferociously, calling Camacho's tenure in office as "unremarkable."

Clearly, the current governor was rattled. And if she was perturbed by the former governor's criticism, what might be her

response to what will undoubtedly be an onslaught of support for an opponent like San Nicolas, who used to be a junior employee at her bank?

No doubt, San Nicolas will be the man to beat in this election. There's no second-guessing his extraordinary ability to connect with voters and appeal to the everyday man and woman's yearning for a better life.

Political Maverick

No doubt as well that he is and continues to be the anti-establishment candidate. He is the guy who basically thumbs his nose at the unwritten political rules long followed by partisan traditionalists on Guam. They view San Nicolas as heretical to Guam's natural political order, the same way some politically astute manamko view their younger relatives with disdain when they don't toe the line on who they are supposed to vote for.

Guam's voters are not unfamiliar with political mavericks. Two-term Gov. Carl T.C. Gutierrez also exuded an aura of political pragmatism and cross-party appeal. Like San Nicolas, Gutierrez

was also considered heretical by partisan traditionalists and the entitled dynastic families of the Democratic Party of Guam both the former Democratic governor and young congressman never figured prominently in.

While San Nicolas's maternal grandfather, the late Sen. Franklin Quitugua may have been one of many democrats to have led legislature as a speaker, Quitugua too was pragmatic and did not always support democratic gubernatorial candidates.

It won't be a walk in the park for MSN, as he affectionately is referred to by many of his supporters. Despite his popularity, he has his energetic detractors. And they are armed with political weapons that guarantee that while San Nicolas won't walk in the mud through the campaign, this nonetheless will be a dirty one.

The inappropriate use of campaign funds alleged mostly by San Nicolas' own former staffer have already stood the test of scrutiny by voters in a previous election, but they continue to surface. The congressman may not be out of the woods either, as the ethics complaint controversy languishes, casting a shadow on his unassailable record of achievement.

He has denied his former staffer's allegations.

Is he even running?

Political prognosticators believe MSN will declare his candidacy for governor this week. Sources close to the congressman report receiving messages from him this past week confirming his intent to run for governor and asking if they are ready to join the campaign.

The last time Mr. San Nicolas was in our studios - some time in January - he all but confirmed his run. The caveat was that he won't announce his run for governor until it is clear his agenda in Washington won't take a hit from such an announcement.

"Once that happens, things turn out differently for the things you're trying to push congressionally," Mr. San Nicolas said on our show. "And we still have things we're pushing congressionally."

Is there anything left for him to do? The two-term congressman's record arguably is most decorated among all the island's delegates to the U.S. House of Representatives. He practically has exhausted success in resolving Guam's wants from the federal government going back decades. You name it, he did it; from war claims to reimbursement of the payment of Earned Income Credit to the

working poor.

MSN last week introduced legislation with his northern counterpart, Gregorio "Kilili" Sablan, to allow the territories to elect delegates to the U.S. Senate. The feat would be pretty cool, if it passes into law. It would be interesting to see who would run from Guam, and who the people will elect. But, taken in analysis of policy, politics, and the timing of both, there could not have been a more telling sign his policy agenda as Guam's delegate has been exhausted.

So, it is no surprise rumors are getting stronger he will announce his bid for governor this week.

Second pick

Then there's the next question: Who is his running mate?

We won't dance around it. We keep hearing he has chosen former adjutant general of the Guam National Guard Gen. Roderick Leon Guerrero. Interesting pick.

It is unsurprising MSN would choose someone not traditionally seen as a politician, or generally involved with a political party. He has never been a political party yes man, gaining significant popularity as a freshman lawmaker, who refused to sign his Democratic Party of Guam unity

pledge. "I serve all the people, not just democrats," he once quipped.

The political pundits wrote the epitaph on his political tombstone that day, claiming such a perceived snub of allegiance to his party would kill his political career at the primary election. He not only bested his colleagues at the primary, he came in a top vote-getter at the next election.

That shook up the foundations of both parties, aware now about the obvious shift in voter mentality. That also drew lines in the sand; others in elected office grew jealous of then-Sen. San Nicolas.

There really is no other way of putting it. For many elected officials at the time, especially democrats, if Mike San Nicolas went one way on an issue, they'd find every excuse to be on the other side of it. And if they couldn't survive the public pressure to take MSN's side, they'd begrudgingly join him or even find ways to take credit for his pioneering ways.

So, despite his popularity, we doubt there are many currently-elected officials who would make a good fit for both a gubernatorial campaign and four years as Adelup's top two managers.

We thought MSN would choose a professional; someone he can present to the public as an accomplished leader, and someone he can get along with. Our sources told us he had considered teachers (his wife, Kathryn Ko San Nicolas, is an educator, and he once was a teacher as well), business executives, and military officers.

It makes sense he reportedly chose the latter. Military officers understand something that would be very important to a Gov. Michael San Nicolas: chain of command.

Gen. Roderick Leon Guerrero is an accomplished and seasoned leader. Politically, we are told he commands the respect of the thousands of current and former soldiers and airmen of the Guam National Guard. So, while MSN brings his own very lopsided political value to the table, it seems his rumored pick for lieutenant governor can bring even more votes.

While it may not figure substantively in terms of policy direction who a candidate for governor chooses to run with, it does seem to matter to voters if that choice is indicative of who else that candidate would surround themselves should he

or she become victorious. In any case, San Nicolas's entry into the race will certainly change the dynamics of the election. This would certainly not be the kind of change welcomed by the political elite.

As for the voters of Guam, having more choices is always a good thing. Otherwise, what else would we have going for those of us who seek change?

Will this upcoming gubernatorial election really end up a contest between the characteristic democrat versus republican —one whose record is defined entirely by that of a pandemic and all its follies vs. one who some say was just "unremarkable" for eight long years?

Perhaps the voters need the populist, heretical, maverick to stir things up.

The Medical Malpractice Mandatory Arbitration Act

On October 31, 2018, Asher Dean Lubofsky died at Guam Memorial Hospital. Asher was admitted the day before, and his condition worsened gradually over night. According to his father, David Lubofsky, in previous statements to Kandit News, his son was never admitted to the ICU despite his deteriorating condition, the nurses never set him up with a breathing tube despite his labored breathing, and a doctor never checked on him through the night.

An investigative report on Asher Dean's death by the U.S. Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services secretly published May 3, 2019, confirmed Mr. Lubofsky's statements, and more. Asher Dean is identified in the CMMS report as Patient 6. Mr. Lubofsky constantly asked the nurses on duty for a doctor to see his son, and for his son to be intubated so he could breathe and rest. The nurses, on the order of doctors whom they had called, gave the boy Albuterol and Tylenol for his symptoms.

Mr. Lubofsky reported these events to the Guam Board of Medical Examiners, the Allied Health Board, and the Guam Board of Nurse Examiners in 2019, but to no avail. At the time, there was no public record of what happened. He eventually filed lawsuits in the Superior and District Courts of Guam for the wrongful death of his son.

Over the summer of 2020, Mr. Lubofsky caught a break. GMH was forced to disclose the May 3, 2019 CMMS report, which implicated the nurses, respiratory therapists, and doctors in the death of Asher Dean. The report included summaries of the interviews with the medical providers, including two women who attended to Asher Dean.

Mr. Lubofsky wrote an editorial for Kandit on November 21, 2020 that read:

"Doctors are not accountable in Guam for medical negligence and that creates apathy, the same apathy and lack of accountability that may relate to the abuse of other staff and allows them to think they can get away with it. This does not apply to all doctors of course. I do not mean to cast a net over the whole medical community, but apathy related to a lack of accountability is an inherently dangerous issue within the medical field on Guam due to protective laws at GMH and island wide.

"Did my son die not only by alleged medical negligence with apathetic people who have no accountability and responsibility to their patients, but also due to the abuse of medical nursing staff by doctors that resulted in nurses "freezing in fear" and prevented them from giving the critical care Asher needed as they waited for a doctor to wake up, too intimidated to call again?"

The current Mandatory Medical Malpractice Arbitration Act states no one in Guam can bring a lawsuit against a healthcare provider for medical malpractice unless the grieving party first goes through medical arbitration at the expense of the grieving party. That expense begins at around \$40,000 to \$60,000 in upfront costs, making arbitration unaffordable for the poor and middle classes. Lubofsky isn't the only grieving party or resident who looks forward to changing the law so that poor and middle class citizens have access to due process through the courts. Others throughout the years have tried to challenge the MMMA Act on the grounds that it violates every citizen's constitutionally protected right to due process.

U.S. District Court Judge Ramona Manglona made it clear, in an order in the Lubofsky case, that if the MMMA Act were to be interpreted by the Guam Supreme Court to force medical arbitration on a grieving party that cannot afford it, then the MMMA Act would certainly violate the Constitution's 14th Amendment.i

UPDATE: Matson drastically increases rates; stock up now

If you thought the price of gas was becoming outrageous, you're not going to like what we have to report.

Effective April 10, 2022, Matson - the shipping company fighting hard to regain a monopoly in the Marianas Islands - is raising its rates; again. And the heavily-profitable Hawaii corporation isn't planning a meager jump. According to its latest announcement, Matson is increasing its fuel surcharge to 47 percent of the price of its ocean freight for Guam and the CNMI.

It's even worse for the other islands of Micronesia. Matson will charge them 51 percent - more than half - the price of ocean freight. For example, if it would cost \$2,000 for a company in Palau to freight a container of eggs, milk, and chicken, Matson will add a 51 percent fuel surcharge, increasing the cost to \$3,020. Guess how much more expensive those eggs, milk, and chicken will become in Palau after April 10.

The situation will be similar in Guam and the CNMI. That same container of eggs, milk, and chicken will increase by 47 percent (the increase previously

was 39.5 percent). If that container's freight cost was \$2,000, then the final price Matson will charge will be \$2,940.

Interestingly, the distance ships sail already is factored into the cost of freight, so it is curious why Matson would charge more for fuel to the rest of Micronesia than it would to Guam and CNMI. Actually, Matson charges Hawaii even less than Guam and the CNMI. It's as if the fuel pumping into the ships to the Mariana Islands is from the mid-grade pump, and the fuel for the other-Micronesia cargo from the premium nozzle.

While Matson may claim it simply is raising the fuel surcharge because of the nationwide increase in the cost of fuel, its regional competitor - APL - has actually decreased its rates this year.

Despite years of evidence of both the competitive prices APL has forced and Matson's multiple attempts on multiple fronts to kick APL out of this region, both the governments of Guam and the CNMI have done absolutely nothing to help the situation.

And with all markets about to price most families out of their livelihoods, it truly is a wonder why our elected representatives of our legislatures, our governors, and our attorneys general won't raise so much as a peep about Matson's practices. Perhaps the answer to our wonder lies in the campaign contributions elected officials receive every two to four years.

Shipping

If Matson shipping has things its way, the company will again have a shipping monopoly on Guam. And with 95 percent of all consumables imported by sea, a great deal of island costs rely on whether Matson achieves its aim. Its only competitor - APL - is trying to prevent the monopoly from happening. And, on the national stage, more conversation is happening to repeal a federal law that has allowed Matson to control so much of our lives: the so-called Jones Act.

A U.S. Senator from Hawaii has been back-channelling both the Biden and Trump administrations on behalf of a Hawaiian shipping company's interests. If she succeeds in her campaign, the cost of nearly all goods sold in Guam and the Northern Mariana Islands will undoubtedly increase even further.

The CNMI and Guam - already isolated, struggling to get by, and lacking voting representation in Congress - have been the target of U.S. Senator Mazie Hirono's (D-Hawaii) efforts to advance Matson shipping's financial interests in the region. Matson is the Hawaii-based shipping company that once enjoyed a monopoly in Guam and the CNMI before APL joined the market in 2015. It also is a major contributor to Ms. Hirono's political campaigns.

The Biden administration, according to Ms. Hirono's most recent letter, is siding with Matson. "Earlier this year," the senator wrote to U.S. Secretary of Transportation Pete Buttigieg, "the Biden Administration moved to remand the case back to MARAD, stating MARAD had erred in their 2020 approval and just this month the United States District Court for the District of Columbia remanded the APL Saipan matter back to MARAD for reconsideration."

The removal of the APL Saipan from the Guam trade will have a crippling affect on the CNMI's already frazzled economy. Should Matson succeed in ridding the Guam trade of APL altogether, the Mariana Islands surely will face even steeper increases to the cost of living.

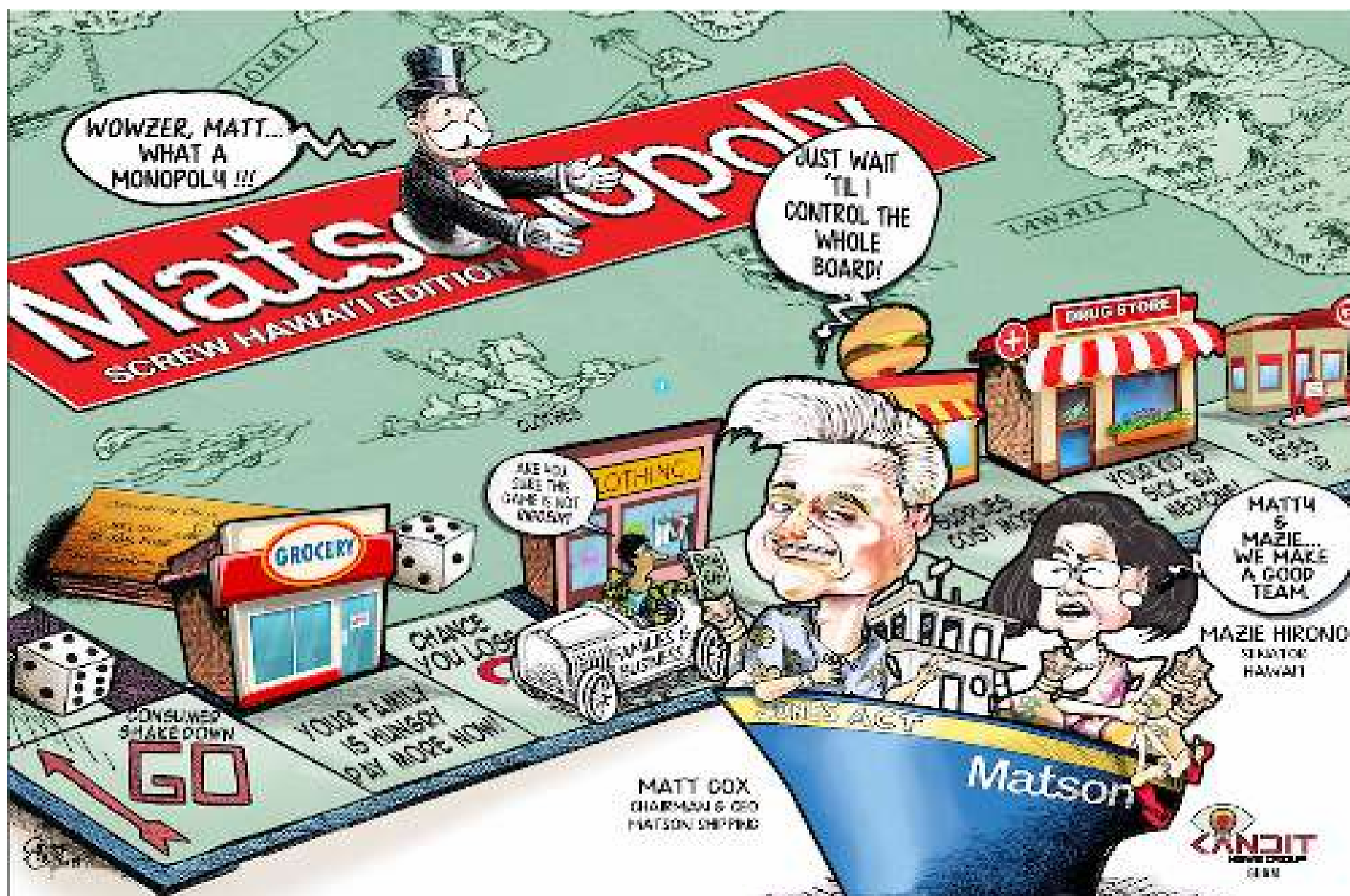
Two questions linger from this exposure of Hirono's quiet campaign involving Guam and Saipan: What the hell does she think she's doing getting involved, where she should mind her damn business? And where the hell are the leaders of Guam and the CNMI on such a critical issue?

During its monopoly years, Matson steeply increased its container shipping rates, driving up the cost of living in the Marianas, where more than 90 percent of all consumables are imported. APL stymied the increases, when it entered the market with its ships. Those ships operate between the U.S. mainland and Guam and the NMI under the authority of the Maritime Security Program.

APL late July of 2021 sued Matson over allegations Matson "has waged a campaign of anticompetitive tactics to exclude APL from the markets for container cargo shipping services between the mainland United States and Guam so that Matson can achieve and maintain its containership monopoly."

It is against both federal and local antitrust laws for a company to employ tactics designed to give that company a monopoly in its industry of operation.

"The establishment, maintenance or use of a monopoly, or an attempt or conspiracy to establish a monopoly, of trade or commerce in a relevant market by any person, for the purpose of excluding competition or

controlling, fixing, or maintaining prices is unlawful.” - §69.20 of the Antitrust Law of Guam

In a lawsuit filed in federal court in Washington, D.C., APL has alleged that Matson has threatened some of its customers that if they ship through APL, Matson will offer lower rates to its customers' competitors.

“Matson actually followed through on its unlawful threats to shippers. APL understands Matson significantly increased rates specifically to its shippers that placed cargo with APL, and Matson refused to promise on-time deliveries for shippers that booked cargo with APL,” the APL lawsuit alleges. “Matson’s threats and punishment of shippers further

disciplined them from doing business with APL, hindering its ability to compete fairly in the U.S./Guam markets."

According to the Guam Antitrust Law (codified at Chapter 69 of the island's criminal code), "A contract, combination, or conspiracy between two (2) or more persons in restraint of, or to monopolize, trade or commerce in a relevant market is unlawful."

\$69.15 of the statute also provides: "A contract, agreement, combination or conspiracy which controls or attempts to control the quantity, price or exchange of any article of manufacture, product of the soil or mind or any goods or services in restraint

of trade is unlawful... Secretly paying or allowing rebates, refunds, commissions, or unearned discounts, whether in the form of money or otherwise, or secretly extending to certain business consumers special services or privilege, not extended to all business consumers purchasing upon like terms and conditions, to the injury of a competitor and where such payment or allowance tends to destroy competition, is unlawful "

Matson three times has taken the U.S. Maritime Administration to court in Washington, D.C., suing U.S. MarAd to revoke the license it has issued to APL to operate in what is called the Guam trade. The

Guam trade involves the shipping lanes that pick up and drop off cargo in Guam, the CNMI, Palau, the Federated States of Micronesia, and the Republic of the Marshall Islands. It is a multimillion-dollar shipping market, which Matson controlled as a monopoly from 2012, when Horizon shipping left Guam, to 2015, when APL entered the market.

During Matson's monopoly, the company mercilessly increased the price of shipping to the Guam trade, leaving the average resident of this region too poor to purchase even food without public assistance.

The victim said the first incident happened in December of 2018 while playing a game of hide and seek and Valencia inserted his finger into the girl. Both the minors parents were aware and did not report it. In December of 2021, the victim said she was sitting behind a water dispenser and Valencia walked up to her, put his hands down her shirt, then moved towards her vagina, "playing" with it. In January of 2022 and between the months of February and March of 2022, the victim reported that Valencia put his finger in her vagina and then penetrated her.
