The battle for the Marianas

Are there nefarious forces behind the scenes of the Catholic churches of Guam and the CNMI? People in the know, say so. From the courageous ilk of JungleWatch authors and Concerned Catholics of Guam to sources from within the steps of power of the Archdiocese of Agana and the Diocese of Chalan Kanoa, the common concern is that a sect of the Roman Catholic Church intent on taking over the churches in the Marianas has gripped onto, and even consolidated its power. And soon, the fear goes, forces from that sect - the Neocatechumenal Way - in Rome will succeed in replacing Archbishop Michael Byrnes, and winning over the young Bishop Ryan Jimenez.

"They want to control everything to push their agenda," a source said. The agenda? Well, here's an abbreviated answer: The Way, as they are called, is a 50-year-old sect (some critics say, 'cult') of the Roman Catholic Church with very different customs and neo-traditions distinct from the practice with which everyday Catholics are familiar. If you liken the Roman Catholic Church to being 'one body in Christ,' critics of the Way might make its evangelizers analogous to HIV. The virus, the logic goes, would invade a healthy cell (a diocese, in this case) by tricking it. Once inside, it manipulates the cell's resources so it can multiply, killing its host as it ruptures and the virus spreads to other cells. In time, the virus is so infectious, it kills off every white blood cell in the body.

The problem, critics of The Way will point out, is that those white blood cells were all that stood in the way between the body and the multitude of diseases out there that would corrupt and destroy it.

The Way is the Roman Catholic Church's iconoclast; and its agenda appears to be progressing in the Mariana Islands. Critics are quick to point out its followers 'are nice people.' "They're the nicest people you'll meet," critics of The Way will say of the sect's everyday followers. There's a seeming acceptance of the existence of their communities, but a loathing for their leadership, who carry forth an agenda of expansion and takeover.

In essence, those faithful to the canons of the Roman Catholic Church may settle for antiretrovirals in lieu of a cure to the modern church's affliction.

And on Guam, a fear is growing

Archbishop Michael Jude Byrnes is sick, both figuratively and literally.

"He's swimming in a full tank of sharks," a former member of the Archdiocesan Curia wrote to me. "There are bad, evil spirits in the Chancery." I've known this source for decades, and he is not one for drama or theatrics.

The authors of JungleWatch and others won't be surprised by such an assessment. Long have they been warning that disgraced ex-bishop Anthony Sablan Apuron's expulsion from Guam by no means ended the so-called affliction and corruption of the leaders of The Way.

"Anthony Apuron was a puppet," another source said. "He had his own personal misdeeds, but as the archbishop, especially in his later years, there were people above him pulling the strings. And those people didn't go away when the Holy Father banished him from Guam."

Pope Francis, following a lengthy investigation in the Vatican, exiled the once-popular and politically-powerful archbishop from Guam in 2019, about four years after Apuron fled the island and went into hiding. His fall from Grace happened amid cascading scandals of mismanagement, sex abuse of children, coverup of those crimes, dispossession of Archdiocesan assets to a New Jersey corporation linked to Apuron's bosses in The Way, and what appeared to be an extensive money laundering scheme.

Perhaps the most damaging misperception of his expulsion has been the masquerade that the pull for Neo power went away with him. By damaging, I mean that those who stood with the pioneers of the anti-Neo movement and the journey to bring justice to victims of the church's cover up of sex crimes have been lulled into a false sense of security about the Archdiocese of Agana, and even the Diocese of Chalan Kanoa.

Those pioneers, people like Tim Rohr, Dave Sablan, Ernee Perez, Pierre Tarrene, and Bob Klitzkie, know better. And they've been vocal; but perhaps we in the laity have been too distracted by the theatrics of so much else that we haven't seen what is right in front of us, yet.

Consider this: Has anyone else, who assisted Apuron in his crimes, been removed from Guam except for defrocked Adrian Cristobal? As for Cristobal, his part in Apuron's mischief is not what threw him into the winds of darkness, a fugitive from justice. He had to leave because of the accusations made against him that he sexually abused altar boys.

Highly reliable sources say he was being considered to replace Apuron as archbishop, and likely would have been appointed by Pope Francis had the rape allegations not been raised in the nick of time.

Imagine that. We could have had another accused pedophile leading the church of Guam in a long line of bishops here, who never had any intention of protecting children as Jesus Christ commanded. And then there's the other implication, or evidence if you will, that Apuron's departure did not decrease the power of The Way at all. People in power were lining up Apuron's lieutenant to be his successor and to further The Way's agenda without Apuron in the picture.

So, if The Way has remained influential post-Apuron and -Cristobal, why didn't the sect have Rome send a Neo-bishop? Why did we get Michael Byrnes?

"They don't need one of their own sitting on that seat," one learned observer said. "They just need someone who won't get in the way of their agenda; better, too, if they get someone who will promote their growth."

Archbishop Byrnes, multiple sources tell Kandit, was hand picked by Apuron's chief puppeteer to head the Archdiocese of Agana.

The sustaining and ever-widening influence of The Way in the Mariana Islands is no work of fate or happenstance. Rome didn't pluck a bishop from a Detroit diocese and drop him on Guam because he'd fit best here. Neither did Ryan Jimenez become Bishop of Chalan Kanoa simply because his shoes fit better there.

"Cardinal Filoni chose them," a source said.

Cardinal Fernando Filoni, demoted by Pope Francis in 2019 to be Grand Master of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem, was the powerful

Prefect of the Congregation for the Evangelization of Peoples, when Rome sent Michael Byrnes to Guam.

Filoni is among the highest ranking church figures in The Way. He is a cardinal bishop (the highest type of cardinal in the ranking of the bishops), and ranked 11 among his brother cardinals.

At the time he arranged for Byrnes's appointment to Guam, his lieutenant, Archbishop Savio Hon was in charge of the Archdiocese of Agana. He filled the vacuum of power Apuron left when he fled in disgrace.

"Archbishop Hon was overheard on the phone one night here on Guam arguing with Cardinal Filoni in Rome," a source told Kandit. "They were screaming at each other, and everyone could hear it."

Archbishop Hon, according to church observers, uncovered the mess Apuron left behind and, more importantly, Filoni's fingerprints on the ordeal the church of Guam was facing. And Filoni's reach didn't stop on the southernmost island of the Mariana Archipelago. Consider the timing of Hon's administration of the Archdiocese of Agana. Guam wasn't the only Mariana island without a bishop; so was the Commonwealth of the Mariana Islands at the time.

The late Bishop Tomas Camacho had retired from service in 2010, and his successor — Bishop Ryan Jimenez — was not appointed until August 2016.

"Monsignor James Benavente from Guam was Camacho's first choice for Bishop of Chalan Kanoa," a source from the church in Saipan told Kandit. "But then the false allegations of financial misappropriation came up against Monsignor James."

Those allegations were raised by Apuron in 2014 right before Apuron removed Benavente and Father Paul Gofigan from their prominent posts in the Archdiocese.

By the time Archbishop Hon and Cardinal Filoni had their screaming match, Hon had uncovered the truth: both Gofigan and Benavente were innocent. The Way and Apuron had felled them in a political hatchet job that eventually backfired. Before Hon could vindicate the two priests, Filoni acted. He rushed to have Jimenez appointed before Benavente was cleared of the charges against him so that Rome would not appoint Benavente to lead the Diocese of Chalan Kanoa.

"The priests in Saipan wondered why Jimenez was selected for a couple of reasons," a source who knew Bishop Camacho said. "First, Ryan has a history that won't bode well if exposed, and second, there were the Chamorro priests who were more than qualified. The going theory was that those other priests would not have allowed the Neo to grow there."

Thus, Jimenez was appointed bishop in August 2016. And Hon vindicated both Gofigan and

Benavente a month later. One month after that, on October 31, 2016, Pope Francis appointed Byrnes Archbishop of Agana.

Bishop Jimenez, JungleWatch author Pierre Tarrene wrote recently, has a laissez faire relationship with The Way in Saipan. "Ryan for some time has been working for Neo takeover," a priest in Saipan told Kandit. "Frenchie seems to be connecting the dots." Frenchie is Tarrene's screen name.

"Filoni left nothing to chance," a source said. "Monsignor James would have been bad news for the Neo agenda in Saipan. Hon knew too much, so they needed to get him out of here quick."

And perhaps Byrnes now knows too much as well, or to the chagrin of the Neo agenda, is injecting some of that figurative antiretroviral to help heal the affliction upon the archdiocese.

"European sources are whispering Byrnes will be removed because of health issues," the Saipan priest told Kandit. Archbishop Byrnes's medical condition has been no secret. He injured his hip and had to receive surgery off island during the pandemic.

"He has been receiving off island care in the U.S. mainland," the Saipan priest said. "But I believe they will replace with a Neo from Canada. The plan is to recapture the Pacific and take over."

While all this may matter to practicing Catholics in the Mariana Islands, it may be less clear how any of this affects the rest of us. Let's be clear about why this should matter to the everyday citizen of the Commonwealth and Guam.

The Roman Catholic Church — the Archdiocese of Agana and the Diocese of Chalan Kanoa, as it affects us in the Mariana Islands — is perhaps the most politically-powerful organization here. Issues rise and fall at the pulpit. Politicians know the bishop's ring carries a luminescent authority, and what he says matters.

Consider the power Apuron wielded; and his predecessor, Bishop Felixberto Flores before him. Consider Apuron's corruption under The Way, and how for decades they conspired to corrupt the Archdiocese of Agana and coverup transgressions that hurt hundreds, if not thousands of innocent children.

There is no doubt in my mind the followers of The Way are wonderful people, who wish to worship the Lord as this sect provides. My late father, my stepmother, my sister have been part of the second Agana community for years. So many of their brothers and sisters throughout communities of Guam reached out to me after my dad's death to bless me and console me.

Their goodness does not erase

the evil the agenda-seekers and the ambitious of this sect have propagated on Guam, and have spread to the Commonwealth.

Apuron's downfall, partly caused by the exposure of his own indecency and his part in the coverup of crimes, did not stop The Way from continuing to cover up sexual abuse and pedophilia. These crimes, like the Catholic Church, are universal; universally corrupt and disgusting.

Where was the law, when a priest from The Way was caught having sex at a southern beach in a car with a minor? Where were public officials, when he was whisked away to another country to evade prosecution?

Among Kandit's first investigative pieces was our exposure of the alleged sexual relationship between a former Mt. Carmel School employee and a then-13-year-old student. The parents of the girl — followers of The Way — did not want to pursue charges for whatever reason, and Archbishop Byrnes literally shut the door on any response to the scandal.

How can the Catholic Church move forward from its decades of abusing children, if it continues to allow The Way to manipulate it into covering up these crimes in the modern era?

Consider this: The Way for years has been so successful in its agenda, that it managed to manipulate such a substantial cross section of the Catholic religious community to cover up crimes against children on both Guam and in Saipan. The conspiracy to cover up these crimes — the chief reason the Archdiocese of Agana is on the hook for hundreds of millions in damages — involves priests, teachers, and even religious orders of sisters! Nuns! Women, whom for decades we have revered for their seeming piety, kindness, and generosity. And for years, we allowed this all to happen because it was just so hard to believe that such good people could be capable of such evil deeds.

This is why the progression of the agenda of The Way should matter to us all.

The Medical Malpractice Mandatory Arbitration Act

On October 31, 2018, Asher Dean Lubofsky died at Guam Memorial Hospital. Asher was admitted the day before, and his condition worsened gradually over night. According to his father, David Lubofsky, in previous statements to Kandit News, his son was never admitted to the ICU despite his deteriorating condition, the nurses never set him up with a breathing tube despite his labored breathing, and a doctor never checked on him through the night.

An investigative report on Asher Dean's death by the U.S. Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services secretly published May 3, 2019, confirmed Mr. Lubofsky's statements, and more. Asher Dean is identified in the CMMS report as Patient 6. Mr. Lubofsky constantly asked the nurses on duty for a doctor to see his son, and for his son to be intubated so he could breathe and rest. The nurses, on the order of doctors whom they had called, gave the boy Albuterol and Tylenol for his symptoms.

Mr. Lubofsky reported these events to the Guam Board of Medical Examiners, the Allied Health Board, and the Guam Board of Nurse Examiners in 2019, but to no avail. At the time, there was no public record of what happened. He eventually filed lawsuits in the Superior and District Courts of Guam for the wrongful death of his son.

Over the summer of 2020, Mr. Lubofsky caught a break. GMH was forced to disclose the May 3, 2019 CMMS report, which implicated the nurses, respiratory therapists, and doctors in the death of Asher Dean. The report included summaries of the interviews with the medical providers, including two women who attended to Asher Dean.

Mr. Lubofsky wrote an editorial for Kandit on November 21, 2020 that read:

"Doctors are not accountable in Guam for medical negligence and that creates apathy, the same apathy and lack of accountability that may relate to the abuse of other staff and allows them to think they can get away with it. This does not apply to all doctors of course. I do not mean to cast a net over the whole medical community, but apathy related to a lack of accountability is an inherently dangerous issue within the medical field on Guam due to protective laws at GMH and island wide.

"Did my son die not only by alleged medical negligence with apathetic people who have no accountability and responsibility to their patients, but also due to the abuse of medical nursing staff by doctors that resulted in nurses "freezing in fear" and prevented them from giving the critical care Asher needed as they waited for a doctor to wake up, too intimidated to call again?"

The current Mandatory Medical Malpractice Arbitration Act states no one in Guam can bring a lawsuit against a healthcare provider for medical malpractice unless the grieving party first goes through medical arbitration at the expense of the grieving party. That expense begins at around \$40,000 to \$60,000 in upfront costs, making arbitration unaffordable for the poor and middle classes. Lubofsky isn't the only grieving party or resident who looks forward to changing the law so that poor and middle class citizens have access to due process through the courts. Others throughout the years have tried to challenge the MMMA Act on the grounds that it violates every citizen's constitutionally protected right to due process.

U.S. District Court Judge Ramona Manglona made it clear, in an order in the Lubofsky case, that if the MMMA Act were to be interpreted by the Guam Supreme Court to force medical arbitration on a grieving party that cannot afford it, then the MMMA Act would certainly violate the Constitution's 14th Amendment.i

UPDATE:Guam governor pushes partial Jones Act reform

Gov. Lou Leon Guerrero this past week took a position on the Jones Act. And while the specifics of her position are yet to be known, she has expressed a desire for Congress to apply an exemption Puerto Rico currently enjoys for the cheaper import of liquid fuel. Such a change, the governor suggested in a letter to several members of Congress, will help to decrease the cost of fuel on Guam.

The problem is that the Jones Act has nothing to do with the cost of liquid fuel on Guam, according to several sources in both the local fuel industry, and in Washington, D.C.

"A foreign carrier brings the fuel directly from Singapore, and makes no other U.S. stops, so the Jones Act doesn't apply to that at all," confirmed one shipping executive.

The governor may simply have been ill-informed of the details of fuel delivery to Guam, a Washington source said, or it could be a deliberate attempt at pandering to voters in an election year. Nonetheless, advocating

for Jones Act exemptions on a broader scale can help in the fight to increase shipping competition on Guam, and keep Matson Navigation from reattaining the monopoly it once enjoyed recently.

If Matson shipping has things its way, the company will again have a shipping monopoly on Guam. And with 95 percent of all consumables imported by sea, a great deal of island costs rely on whether Matson achieves its aim. Its only competitor - APL - is trying to prevent the monopoly from happening. And, on the national stage, more conversation is happening to repeal a federal law that has allowed Matson to control so much of our lives: the so-called Jones Act.

A U.S. Senator from Hawaii has been back-channelling both the Biden and Trump administrations on behalf of a Hawaiian shipping company's interests. If she succeeds in her campaign, the cost of nearly all goods sold in Guam and the Northern Mariana Islands will undoubtedly increase even further.

The CNMI and Guam - already isolated, struggling to get by, and lacking voting representation in Congress - have been the target of U.S. Senator Mazie Hirono's (D-Hawaii) efforts to advance Matson shipping's financial interests in the region. Matson is the Hawaii-based shipping company that once enjoyed a monopoly in Guam and the CNMI before APL joined the market in 2015. It also is a major contributor to Ms. Hirono's political campaigns.

The Biden administration, according to Ms. Hirono's most recent letter, is siding with Matson. "Earlier this year," the senator wrote to U.S. Secretary of Transportation Pete Buttigieg, "the Biden Administration moved to remand the case back to MARAD, stating MARAD had erred in their 2020 approval and just this month the United States District Court for the District of Columbia remanded the APL Saipan matter back to MARAD for reconsideration."

The removal of the APL Saipan from the Guam trade will have a crippling affect on the CNMI's already frazzled economy. Should Matson succeed in ridding the Guam trade of APL altogether, the Mariana Islands surely will face even steeper increases to the cost of

living.

Two questions linger from this exposure of Hirono's quiet campaign involving Guam and Saipan: What the hell does she think she's doing getting involved, where she should mind her damn business? And where the hell are the leaders of Guam and the CNMI on such a critical issue?

During its monopoly years, Matson steeply increased its container shipping rates, driving up the cost of living in the Marianas, where more than 90 percent of all consumables are imported. APL stymied the increases, when it entered the market with its ships. Those ships operate between the U.S. mainland and Guam and the NMI under the authority of the Maritime Security Program.

APL late July of 2021 sued Matson over allegations Matson "has waged a campaign of anticompetitive tactics to exclude APL from the markets for container cargo shipping services between the mainland United States and Guam so that Matson can achieve and maintain its containership monopoly."

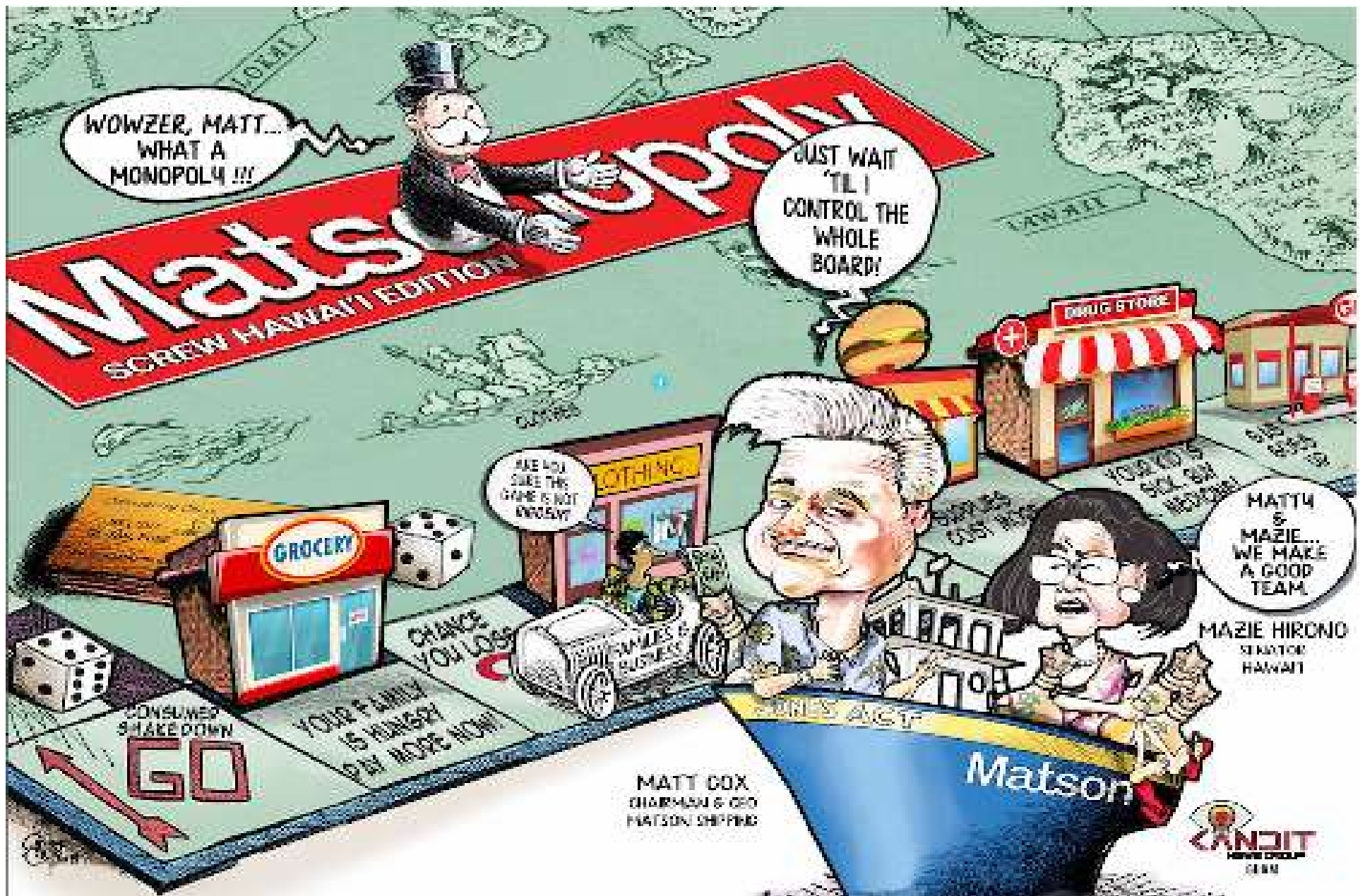
It is against both federal and local antitrust laws for a company to employ tactics designed to give that company a monopoly in its industry of operation.

"The establishment, maintenance or use of a monopoly, or an attempt or conspiracy to establish a monopoly, of trade or commerce in a relevant market by any person, for the purpose of excluding competition or controlling, fixing, or maintaining prices is unlawful." - §69.20 of the Antitrust Law of Guam

In a lawsuit filed in federal court in Washington, D.C., APL has alleged that Matson has threatened some of its customers that if they ship through APL, Matson will offer lower rates to its customers' competitors.

"Matson actually followed through on its unlawful threats to shippers. APL understands Matson significantly increased rates specifically to its shippers that placed cargo with APL, and Matson refused to promise on-time deliveries for shippers that booked cargo with APL," the APL lawsuit alleges. "Matson's threats and punishment of shippers further disciplined them from doing business with APL, hindering its ability to compete fairly in the U.S./Guam markets."

According to the Guam Antitrust Law (codified at Chapter 69 of the island's criminal code), "A contract, combination, or conspiracy between two (2) or more persons in restraint of, or to monopolize, trade or commerce in a relevant market is unlawful."

\$69.15 of the statute also provides: "A contract, agreement, combination or conspiracy which controls or attempts to control the quantity, price or exchange of any article of manufacture, product of the soil or mind or any goods or services in restraint of trade is unlawful... Secretly paying or allowing rebates, refunds, commissions, or unearned discounts, whether in the form of money or otherwise, or secretly extending to certain business consumers special services or privilege, not extended to all business consumers purchasing upon like terms and conditions, to the injury of a competitor and where such payment or allowance tends to destroy competition, is

unlawful "

Matson three times has taken the U.S. Maritime Administration to court in Washington, D.C., suing U.S. MarAd to revoke the license it has issued to APL to operate in what is called the Guam trade. The Guam trade involves the shipping lanes that pick up and drop off cargo in Guam, the CNMI, Palau, the Federated States of Micronesia, and the Republic of the Marshall Islands. It is a multimillion-dollar shipping market, which Matson controlled as a monopoly from 2012, when Horizon shipping left Guam, to 2015, when APL entered the market.

During Matson's monopoly, the company mercilessly increased

the price of shipping to the Guam trade, leaving the average resident of this region too poor to purchase even food without public assistance.

The Office of the Attorney General of Guam has stated its interest in the case, and its outcome. Guam has a local antitrust statute nearly identical to its federal counterpart. The statute grants the attorney general broad powers of enforcement.

Police interviewed B.C. who confirmed that Eram had touched her left breast with an empty bottle and reached with his left hand to touch her left breast. B.C. said that she felt uncomfortable, disgusted, and violated.

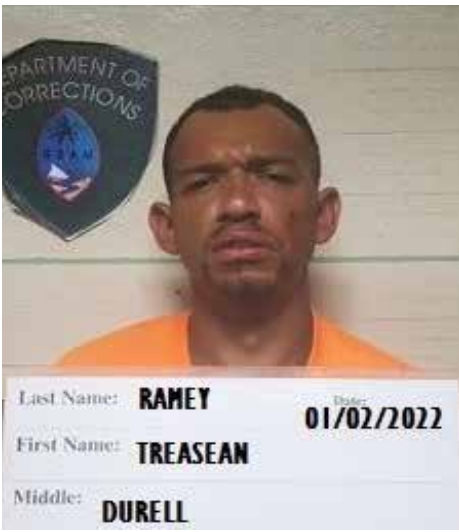
