#### FIRST CHARGE

On or about the 25<sup>th</sup> day of March, 2022, in Guam, **DARREN JAMES QUINATA**, did commit the offense of *Resisting Arrest (As a Misdemeanor)*, in that, with the intent to prevent or delay the arrest of himself, by Guam Police Officers, whom he knew or reasonably should have known to be a peace officers acting in an official capacity, he prevented or delayed that arrest by a threat of force, the use of force or physical obstruction, in violation of 9 GCA § 55.35, as amended.

### SECOND CHARGE

On or about the 25th day of March, 2022, in Guam, ANTHONY GEORGE QUENGA, did commit the offense of *Resisting Arrest* (As a Misdemeanor), in that, with the intent to prevent or delay the arrest of himself, by Guam Police Officers, whom he knew or reasonably should have known to be a peace officers acting in an official capacity, he prevented or delayed that arrest by a threat of force, the use of force or physical obstruction, in violation of 9 GCA § 55.35, as amended.

# IN THE SUPERIOR COURT OF GUAM DECLARATION

I, J. BASIL O'MALLAN III, a duly appointed Chief Prosecutor, aver upon information and belief that the following is accurate. I have reviewed Guam Police Reports 22-8272 submitted by Officers C. Champion, A. Fabila, and J. Tagawa. A review of said report has revealed the following occurred on Guam.

On or about 2:35 a.m., March 25, 2022, Officers Champion and Tagawa were patrolling in the Tumon area when they observed a Toyota Camry with no front license plates. The report indicates that when they tried to stop the Camry it made a quick U-Turn and sped off. Despite being chased by police cars with sirens and emergency lights activated, the driver of the Camry refused to pull over. During the course of the chase the Camry drove the Camry onto on-coming lanes on Marine Corps Drive several times, forcing traffic having to avoid collisions. The driver of the Camry led police throughout Tumon, Tamuning, Harmon, Dededo and Yigo before ending up driving on Route 15, (the back road to Anderson). While speeding on Route 15, the Camry started ramming the patrol car occupied by Officers Champion and Togawa. As a result of the ramming, Officer J.Tagawa (Victim) sustained injuries to his neck. The report indicates that patrol cars were able to force the Camry to a stop. The report indicates that officers were able to identify ANDREW VELASCO TOVES (Defendant 1) as the driver of the Camry.

The report also indicates that other occupants of the vehicle were ordered out of the vehicle, but they refused. The report indicates that officers ordered **DARREN**JAMES QUINATA (Defendant 2) from the vehicle. The report also states that despite many demands that he exit the vehicle QUINATA refused to comply and braced his arms on the vehicle's door frame to prevent being pulled out of the vehicle. After being "tasered" and removed from the vehicle QUINATA continued to resist and clenched his fists under his body in an attempt to avoid hand restraints being placed on him.

The report also indicates that officers ordered ANTHONY GEORGE QUENGA (Defendant 3) from the vehicle, but he also refused. Officers were able to remove QUENGA from the vehicle, but he also clenched his fists and placed his hands under his body and continued to refuse to follow police commands.

Based on the foregoing there is probable cause to charge:

DARREN JAMES QUINATA (Defendant 2) with RESISTING ARREST (As a Misdemeanor) in violation of 9 GCA §55.35; and

ANTHONY GEORGE QUENGA (Defendant 3) with RESISTING ARREST (As a Misdemeanor) in violation of 9 GCA §55.35.

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct. Executed on this 26<sup>th</sup> day of March, 2022.
